By appointment, free of charge, one of our RNs and a nursing student will meet with you for a BP check, home safety assessment, medication review, and a friendly visit, either in our office or at your home. Nursing students are here for their Community Health and Psychiatric clinical; we'd like to keep them busy. Minutes of the Santa Clara Women's League General Meeting Santa Clara Senior Center, Room 232, Santa Clara, CA Tuesday, January 14, 2020 at 1 p.m., 27 Members and 2 Guests Present

CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order by President Marti Ragone at 1 p.m.

GUEST SPEAKER: Maria Lopes asked Emmy Moore Minister to introduce guest speaker Bradley Davis the Chancellor of the West Valley-Mission Community College District who was formerly the longtime President of West Valley College and involved with Bond Measure campaigns to benefit the district. Although he discussed the needs of traditional students in the areas of housing and transportation and their high rate of transfer to 4-year colleges; he also talked about the history of the district and about the many classes and programs developed for our community. Mission College is an age-friendly campus and a Wellness Center being developed at Mission College will also be available to the community. The district has theater and bike paths open to the public and programs for veterans. 30% of students are community members taking only 1 class. He also said that he would be glad to provide interested SCWL members with a walking tour of Mission College.

The business part of the meeting was called to order at 1:20 p.m. Marti moved up Kristine Beebe's announcement about Mission College looking for volunteers to assist with their Second Harvest Food Bank program to the top of Agenda. Kristine passed around a sign-up sheet to get names and contact information for those interested in helping.

She also said that Dorothy Carlson would be presenting the Treasurer's report because Nancy Velasco needed to be excused to handle a family emergency. Help needed with Bar and Soda Sales. Anyone volunteering to work the Admissions table can leave early once performance starts. 2) Jenny Schoger passed around sign-up sheets for baskets.
