Notes from the Nurses

Holy smokes - the Year of the Tiger has begun and life continues to present big changes. Our thoughts are with the citizens of Ukraine.

In the Health & Wellness Program, we anticipate the County's indoor masking mandate ending on March 2nd for vaccinated individuals. As City staff, we will also need to receive direction from our management on the protocol for the Senior Center. No news on that as of now. The case count continues to decline, but there are still about 500 new cases a day on average, so that tells us that Covid is still circulating in our community. If you are not vaccinated and boosted, please fix that ASAP – this is a terrible, terrible disease with long-lasting effects if you end up in the hospital.

We have posted our two job openings, one for a second RN Care Manager and one for a social worker, both part-time positions, about 20 hours a week. Our pay rate is competitive and these are terrific jobs for people with experience, so please help pass the word. Please don't tell people to contact Mallory directly; they should apply online through the City's HR department webpage. So far, we can see that lots of people are looking at the postings, but no one has yet submitted an application. We hear from our aging services associates that this is also the case for their open positions, so the labor shortage hits home. The postings will be active and open until they are filled.

In Person events are returning to the Senior Center! Please see your Howdy Packet for the flyers or the March Senior Center newsletter online for details. We have two tabling events by Bay Area Older Adults to provide mail-in envelopes to return expired medications. Bring your unneeded meds and they'll help you package them up so you can drop them at the post office. On another day, Bay Area Older Adults will also be hosting a virtual tour of Blair Ranch, which is usually closed to the public. We will be streaming the tour simultaneously at the Senior Center, in case people would like to watch it together or who don't know how to stream. Call Mallory if you would like to join that event. Last, Breath California will be coming to the Senior Center to talk about the latest information on lung health, asthma, and COPD. They will also provide a free breathing assessment. Dates and details for all of these are in the Senior Center March newsletter.
