- 1. Covid19 case count, positivity rates, and the County waste water surveillance are all trending UP. Time to use our prevention skills as we move into this year's winter wave. That means get the combo booster vaccine that has been available since September if you haven't already. Data shows that it is even more effective at preventing hospitalization and serious illness than the previous boosters. And if you had a rough experience with your last booster, you can get something different this time. Only 1-2 people out of 10 are getting boosted, even in our County. In addition, we should all be wearing our masks in crowded indoor spaces - think grocery store, Costco, the nail salon on a busy day, restaurants if seated inside, etc. And last, when getting together for fun occasions and it's too cold for outdoors, keep some fresh air moving through the room - open some windows, even if you have to crank up the heat. Even a light case of Covid can cause Long Covid - you don't want that!
- 2. Our annual Giving Tree begins on Monday, 11/28, and we would love some help providing items to those who need a little TLC this holiday season. Mostly what is needed are gift cards for food, clothing, and gas.
