Wow! Our sponsored holiday meal for the Senior Center dining out program is right around the corner (Thurs. Dec. 14th). We already have four volunteers to help with the festivities – Maria Landaveri, Alma Guillot, Nancy Velasco, and Renie Goodwin. We usually have approx. 10-12 members helping. We'd love for some of our new members to join in on the fun. For those of you who haven't participated in the past, here are the details.

We need to arrive by 10:45 (doors open at 11:00). We wear our "uniform" – black slacks or skirt, and a white top. If you have a Santa hat or a silly headband feel free to wear that too. I will have League aprons for everyone.

Basically we're there to greet the guests, walking around the dining area and talking to the folks at the tables. We wish them happy holidays, chitchat etc. The Golden Tones will be singing holiday music and some of our ladies really get involved in the spirit and dance around a little, sing along and so on. That encourages the guests to get in a festive mood.
