Health & Wellness Program Updates

In November, our program focus is on National Family Caregivers Month. That means YOU! On average, in their care of another adult or dependent child, caregivers spend:

- 13 days each month on tasks such as shopping, food preparation, housekeeping, laundry, transportation, and giving medication;
- 6 days per month on feeding, dressing, grooming, walking, bathing, and assistance toileting;
- 13 hours per month researching care services or information on disease, coordinating physician visits or managing financial matters.

This is essential, exhausting, important work and we honor those who are filling these roles in their families.

We have a lot of activities this month and our nursing students are available for home visits to check blood pressures, provide health information, and just chat. They're will us on Tuesdays and Thursdays for the month, so please contact Mallory to book an appointment!

We are changing the Giving Tree a bit this year. We have been supporting about a dozen households with free incontinence supplies – diapers and pull-ups, disposable pads for the bed or chair, and body wipes. These items are often not covered by insurance and are really expensive. When people don't have the supplies they need, they stay home, they don't stay as clean as they should (so are more at risk for UTIs and other infections), and sometimes forfeit food or other necessities in order to buy what they need. This year, we ask for "A Clean and Dry" holiday with the donation of these items. Our Giving Trees in the Senior Center lobby will have ornaments of specific items. We are also collecting gift cards for some of our regulars who need our TLC this holiday. Deadline for donations is Friday, December 20, 3pm.
